ne moment ends season for senior

Lightening usually doesn't strike twice in the same place.

In this case it struck twice on the same team.

On Dec. 6, 2008 the Moundbuilders men's basketball team lost senior Alwyn Jordan to a ruptured Achilles during a game against the Tabor Bluejays.

This injury, which resulted in the end of Jordan's playing days at Southwestern, came three weeks after senior Justin Diggles, an All-Conference Honorable Mention pick from last season, suffered a career ending knee

Jordan, a first team All Conference pick from last year, took the news hard when he found out. "When I found out about my injury I was very upset because I felt that all the workouts that I did this summer were a waste

because I was not going to be able to finish my senior season. I didn't do much to handle the stress. I just tried not to think about it or hang out with my teammates, just to get my mind off of it," said

The initial disappointment was understandable. At the time Jordan was the third leading scorer for the Moundbuilders, averaging just over 12 points per game, despite battling a hand injury at the start of the season.

However, after time he began to deal with the troublesome thought of not playing for the Builders anymore.

"I really didn't go to anyone for advice. All my friends, family and coaches all gave me some type of encouragement to keep my head up and stay strong,' said Jordan.

He also got some help from a close friend. That friend was someone who was going through an extremely similar situation, his teammate Dig-

Diggles said, "I just asked him if he needed anything or if I could provide something for him. We are still just buddies, but we have each other's back for anything."

The two could be seen last semester walking through campus, unfortunately with the aid of crutches. Jordan has since shed those crutches and Diggles is only two weeks away from getting off

The nature of Jordan's injury was perhaps the hardest part for any fan of the team to deal with. It's not common in basketball.

Loch Schnelle, assistant athletic trainer, said, "To put it in perspective we have had five ACL injuries this year. For football you can probably expect two to three a year. This is my fifth year doing athletic training and

cord injury while playing

basketball with friends. Lynn and assist Kin Crandall, head won't be able to compete in football again. Lynn remains positive and has started rehabilitation. Lynn said he has made a full recovery, but is trying to get his strength back and is continuing his rehabilitation at Dallas Methodist Hospital near his home.

DeAires Lynn loves the game of football. He said he plans to return in the fall football couch, with coaching the running back position. Crandall said it was a

shock when he heard the news of Lynn's injury.

"You see injuries such as a knee or an ankle and realize they'll make a recovery and be back next season and it's not necessarily a big deal. With DeAires it's obviously different and it'll take a lon-

ger time for him to come back."

Crandall said that Lynn's attitude on and off the field was great.

"Out on the field he'd always be smiling, and matter of fact, the team nicknamed him Smiley because he'd always have a smile on his face," said Crandall.

Crandall said he helped out the team quite a bit this

"He did a tremendous job this year at the running back spot. He gave great effort and pushed for that extra yard and did everything we asked of him," said Crandall.

Gary Cooper, engineering and physics freshman, is Lynn's suitemate. Cooper said, "Lynn was a pretty laid back and willing to help whenever help is needed. He


was very into his books and would be in his room studying all the time."


